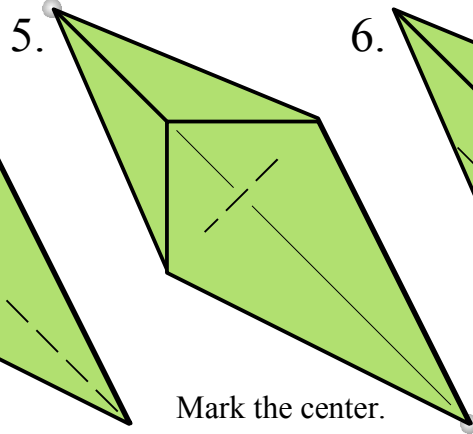
1. Start with a colorful bird base with the wings down.



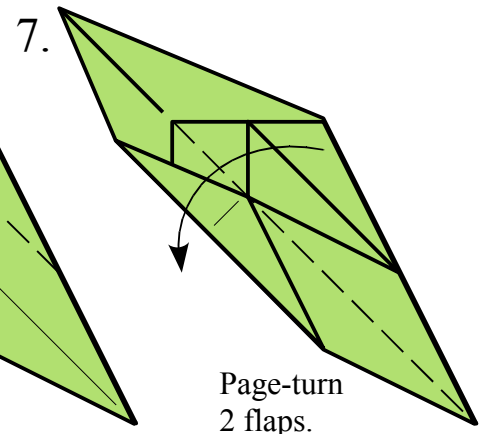
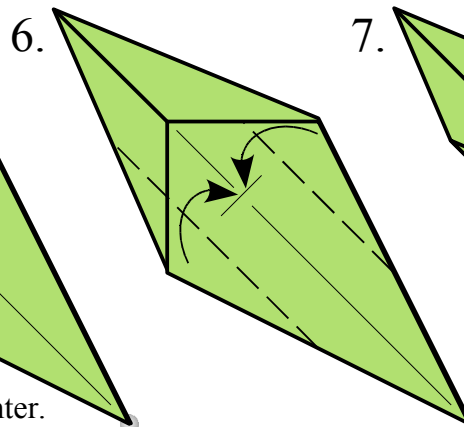
2. Fold one flap up.



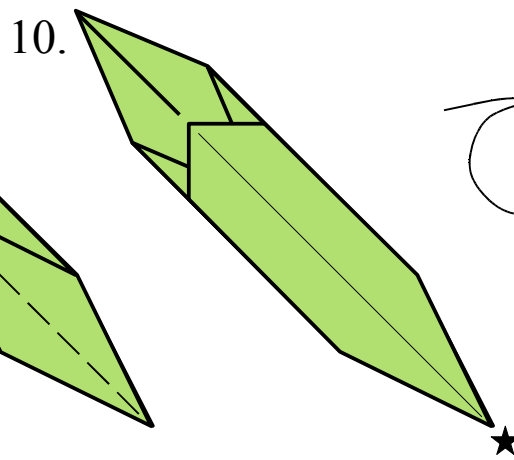
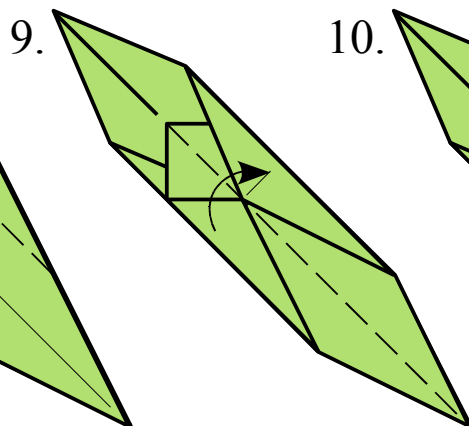
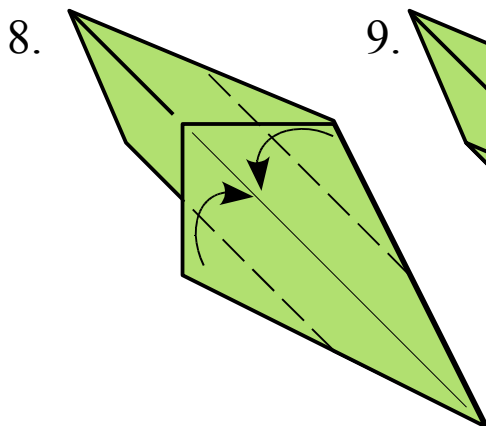
