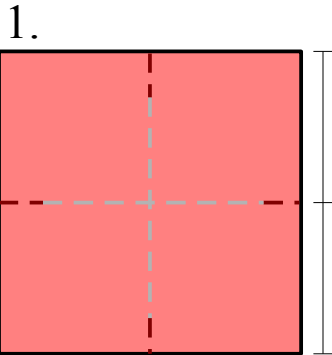
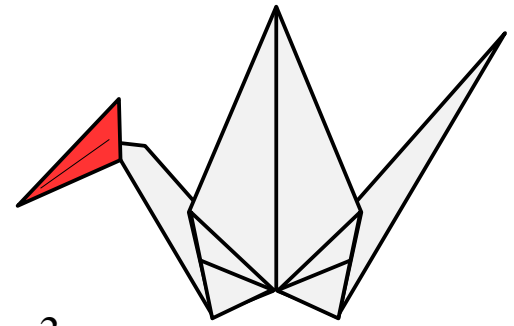


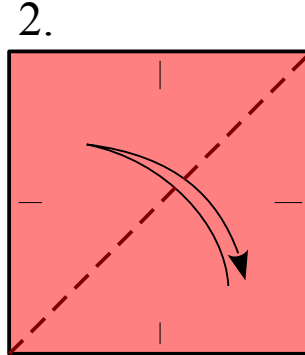
Crested Crane

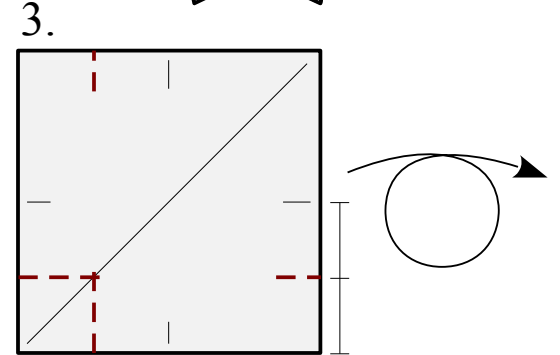
Recommended Paper: very thin two-sided 6" (15cm) square or larger.



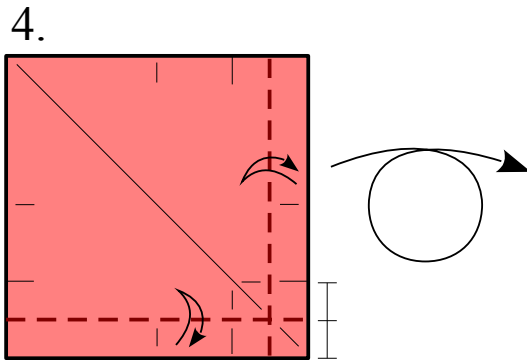
Pinch the book folds.



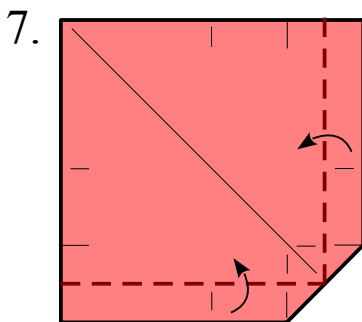
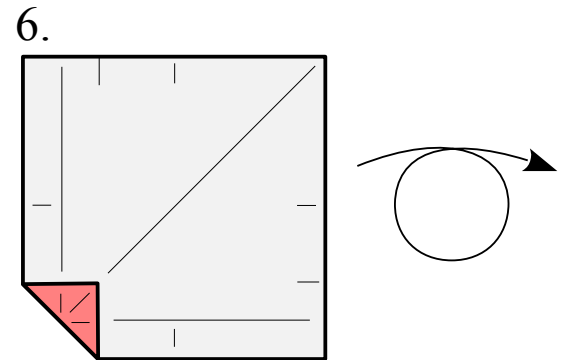
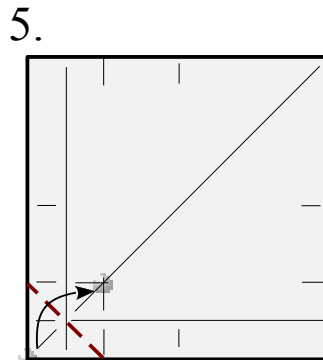
Fold and unfold.



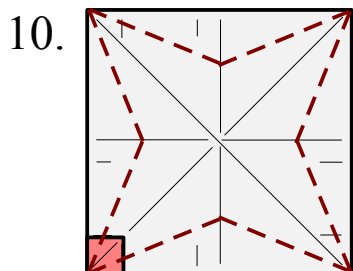
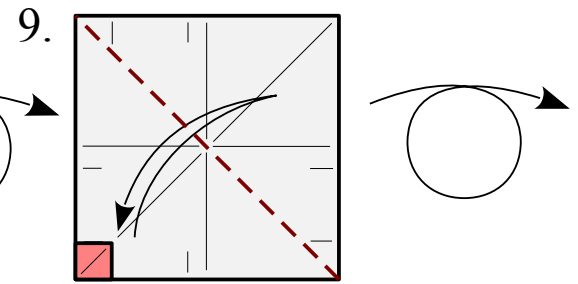
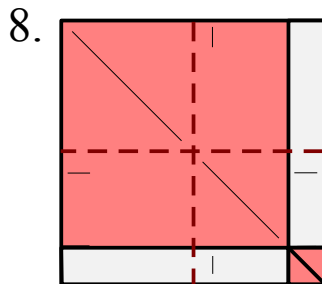
Pinch the quarters.



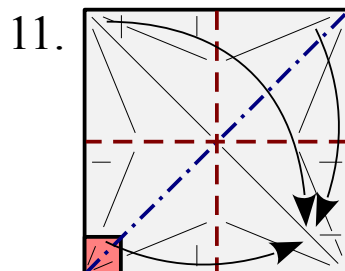
Pre-crease.



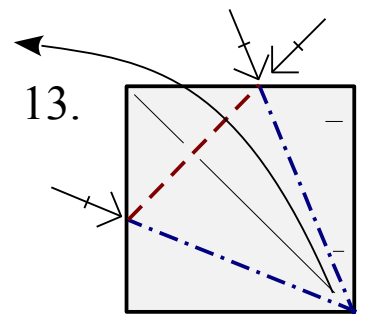
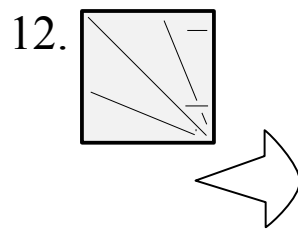
Refold the eighths.
No new creases.



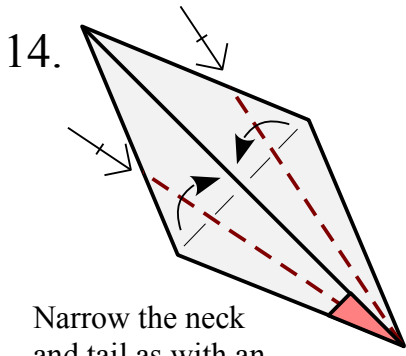
Pre-crease.



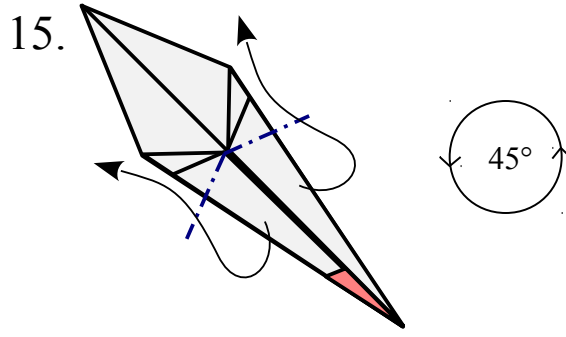
Collapse as a preliminary base.



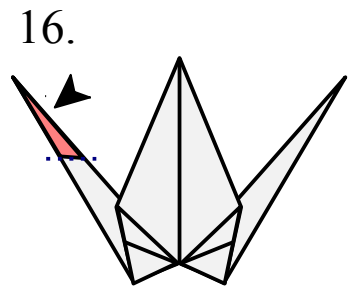
Petal fold . Repeat behind.



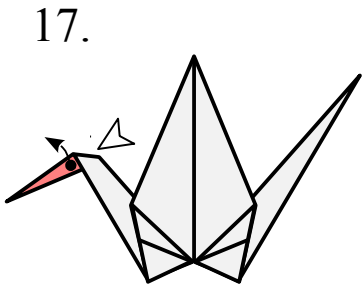
Narrow the neck and tail as with an unmodified traditional crane.



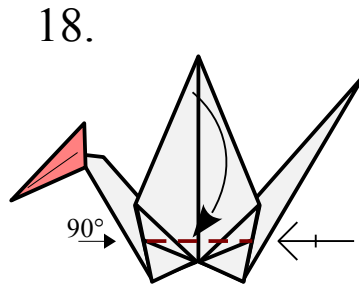
Inside-reverse the neck and tail, again as with an unmodified traditional crane.



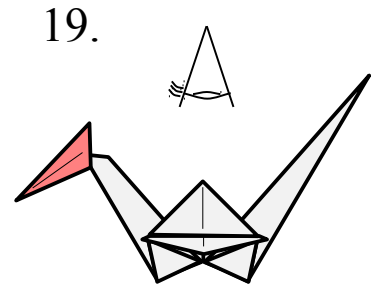
Inside-reverse to form the head.



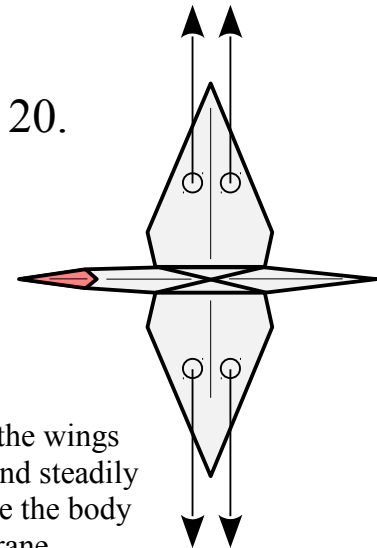
“Un-inside-reverse” to release one layer of paper to form the crest. A toothpick or burnishing tool can reach into the narrow space and release the paper all the way to the tip of the beak.



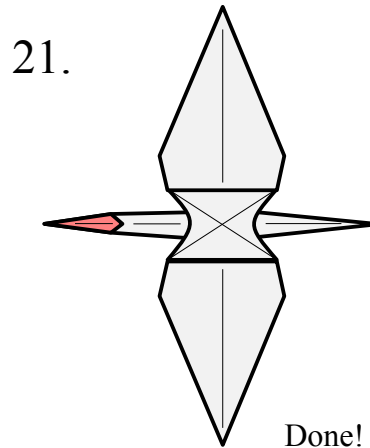
Fold the wings down and crease moderately sharply so that they will remain more horizontal after inflating the crane. Raise the wings back to 90°.



New view.



Tug on the wings gently and steadily to inflate the body of the crane.
