



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Action


Storyline


Fortunately, there was a path to the base of the second waterfall and it started on the near side of the mountain.

When I reached the base of the waterfall, I bent over...


Start this collapse, but finish it with the next line of the story. The grayed out valley folds will be bends and become new creases in the next step of the story.


Pre-crease.

Mountain fold the wing behind, allowing the white point to pop up on the precrease. With the wing in position, it is easy to squish and complete the hood (a.k.a. outside-reverse) fold symmetrically, but save that for the next step of the story.

Finish squishing the head evenly into place.

Pre-crease as a valley fold. Long and thin makes the bird look more like a hummingbird but it also makes it more difficult to flap the wings.

Pre-crease again, but this time as a mountain fold.



There might be more of them, whatever they were, so I stopped halfway to

Hood (outside-reverse) fold


and rotate.
