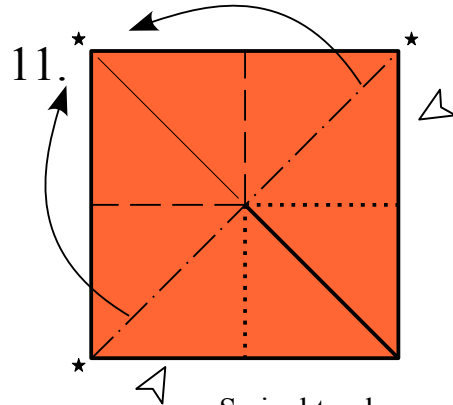
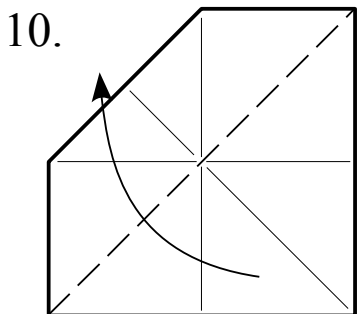
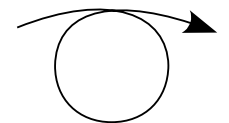
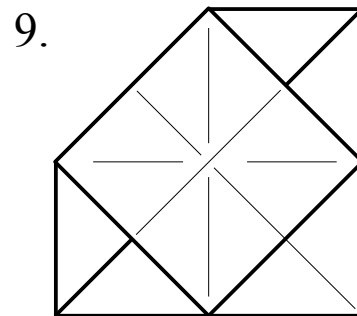
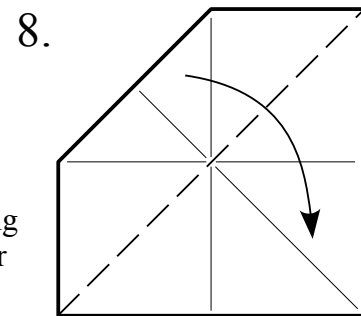
Oddity! This butterfly is folded from Robert Harbin's "Unbasic Form," as described in Eric Kenneway's Complete Origami.



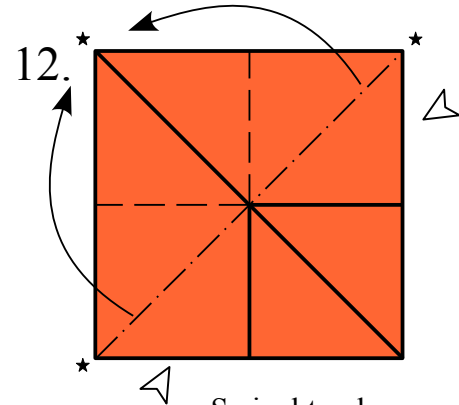
Collapse to a white, sunken primary base. No new creases.



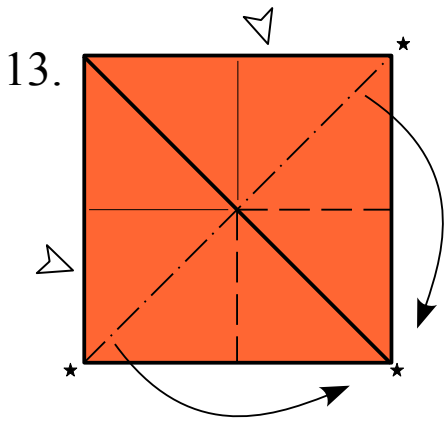
Fold the top layer on the existing crease, pulling the sunken paper into a flat square.



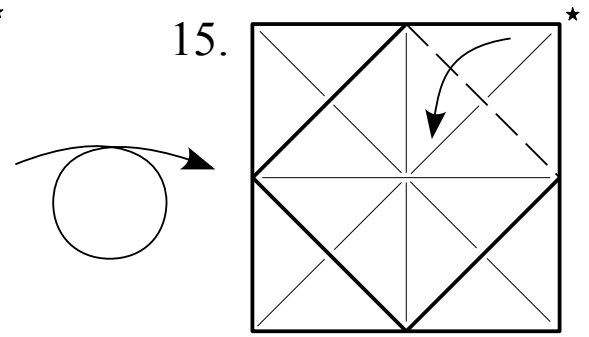
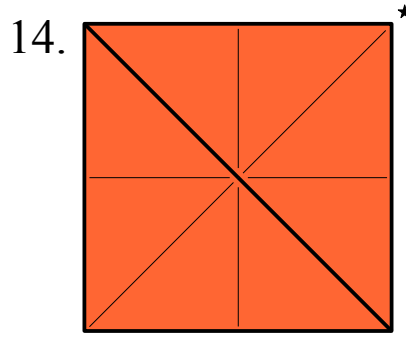
Swivel top layer.
