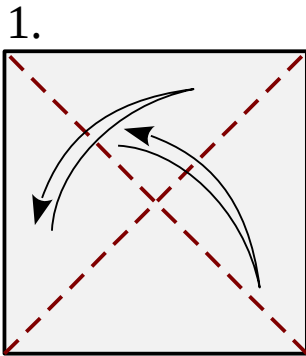


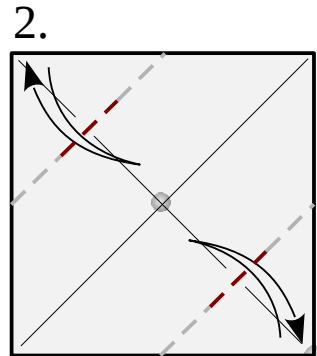
Cicada Longwings

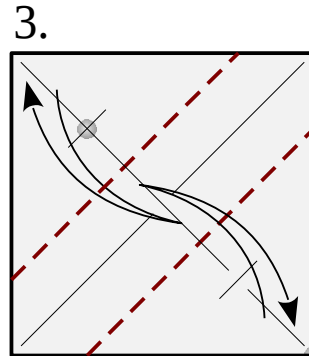
Recommended Paper:
2-4" (50-100cm) kami,
copy paper, memo cube
paper, duo or paper-
backed foil.



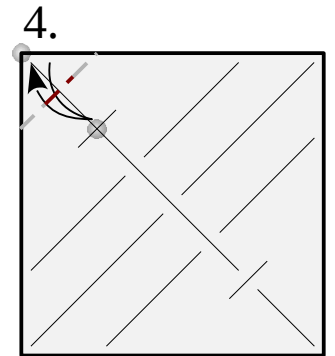
Fold and unfold.



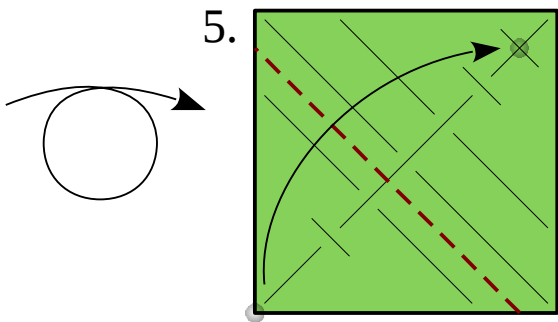
Bring the two (2) corners to the center and pinch across the diagonal.



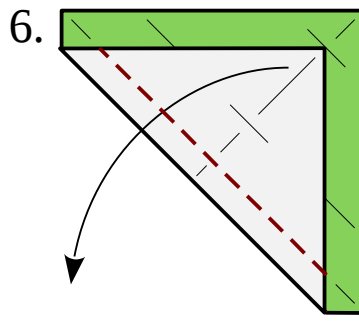
Fold each of the two (2) corners to the further pinch mark and unfold.



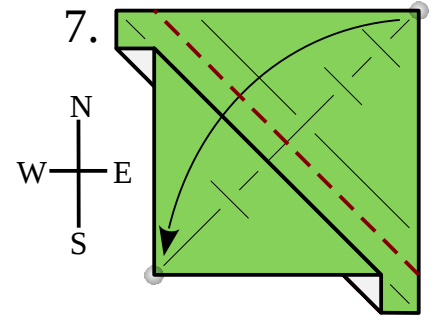
Bring one (1) corner to the nearest pinch for a new pinch across the diagonal.



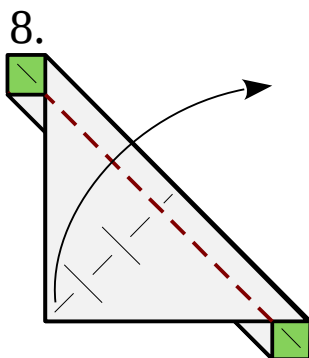
Fold the furthest corner to the newest pinch mark.



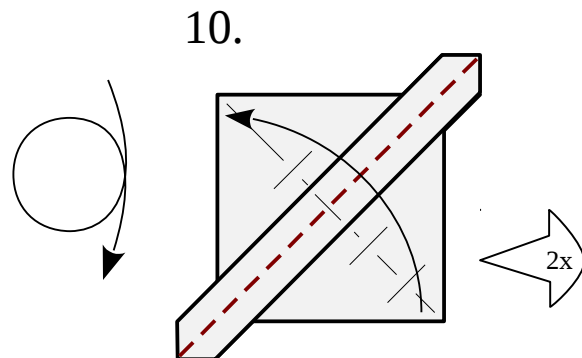
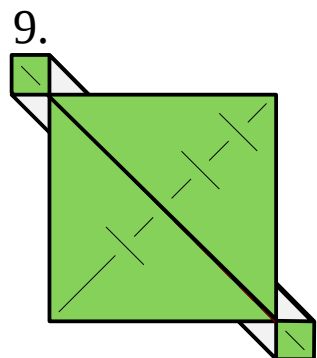
Refold the existing crease.



Fold the NE corner to the SW corner. Swapping roles may lose the existing pleat.

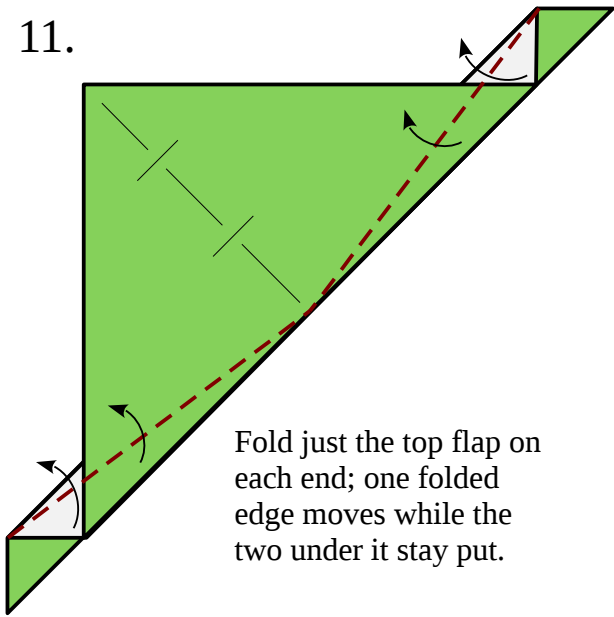


Refold the existing crease.



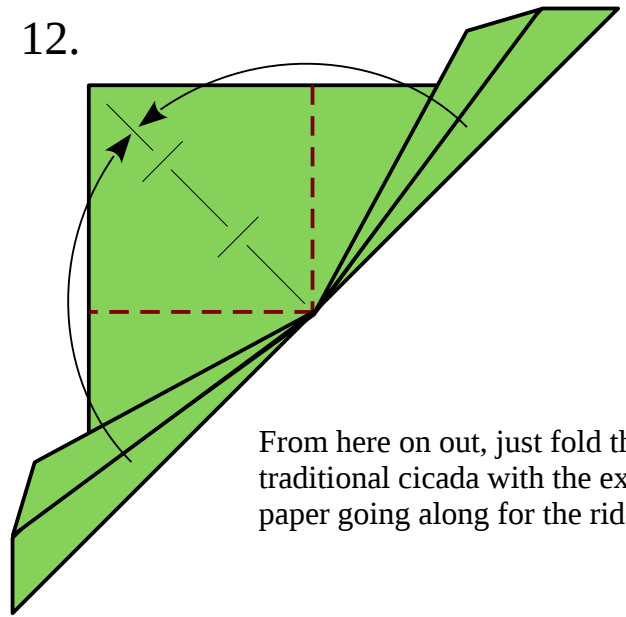
Fold on half diagonally.

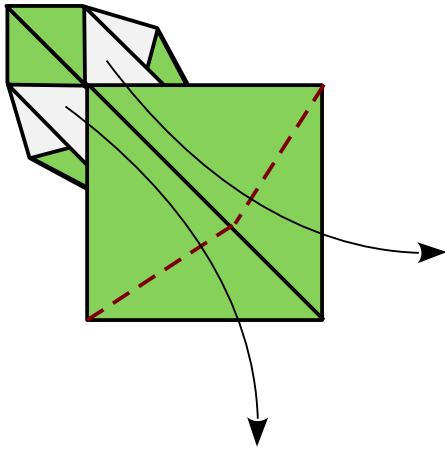
Fold just the top flap on each end; one folded edge moves while the two under it stay put.

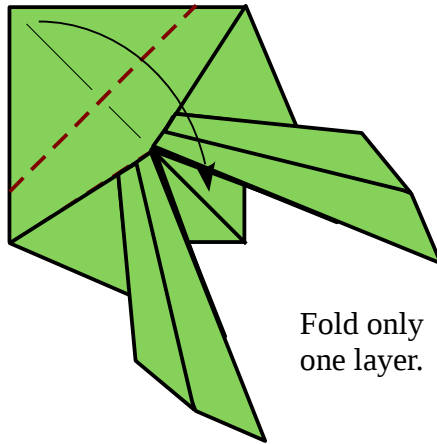


From here on out, just fold the traditional cicada with the extra paper going along for the ride!

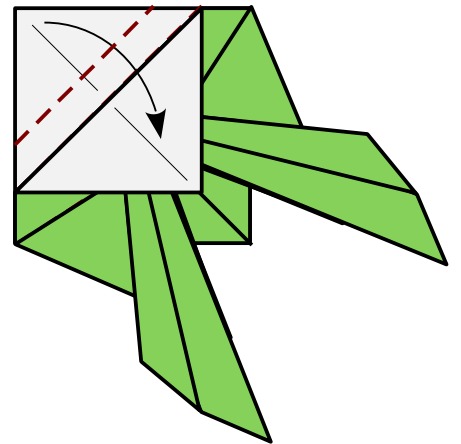

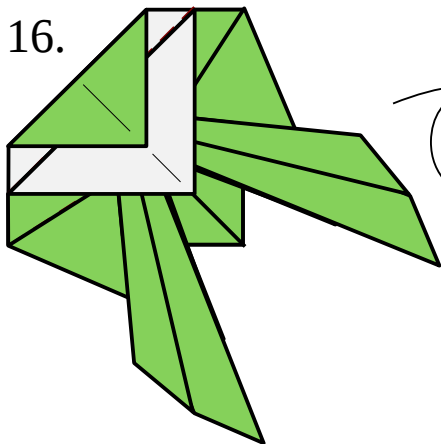


Fold only one layer.

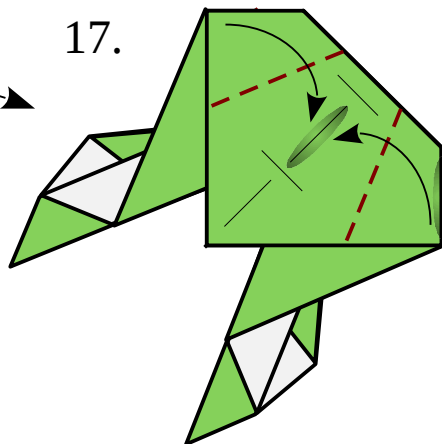

Fold the short outer edges to the center crease line.

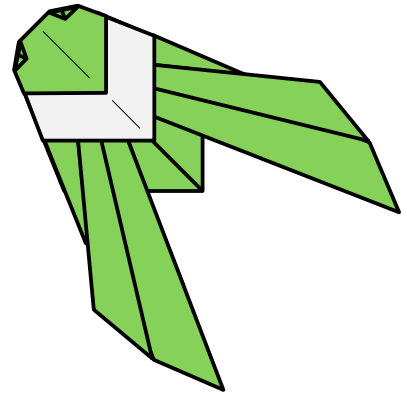
