These 3D numbers and letters mostly use the same size paper, but a few other sizes are needed for some of the characters. Using relative sizes keeps the thicknesses (and the size of the grid squares) equal. These sizes of paper can all be created from a master size square with simple divisions, as shown below. Most of the models use Size B and an $8 \times 8$ grid.
