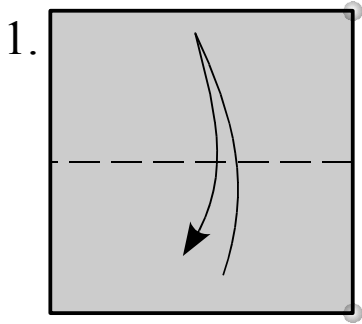

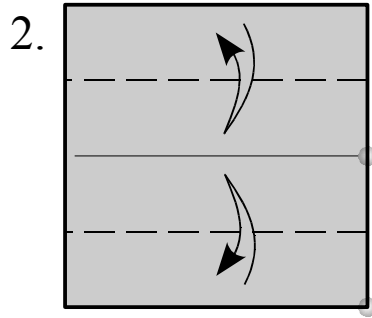

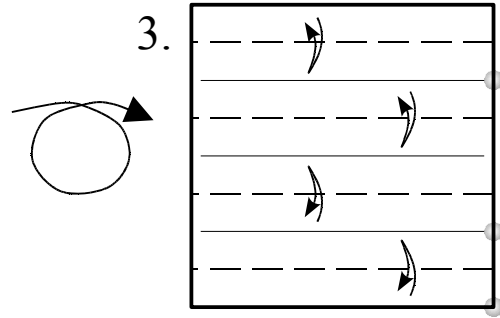
Recommended Paper: 3"-6" (75mm-150mm) square.



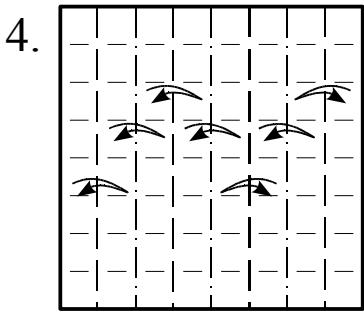

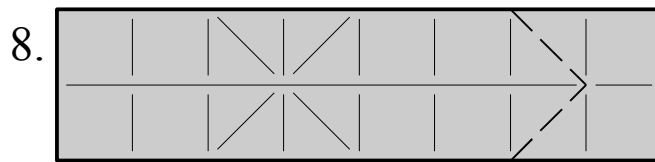
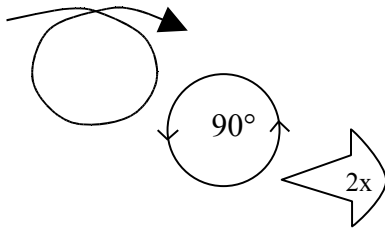
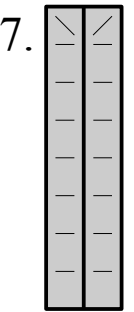
Repeat steps 1-3 crosswise.



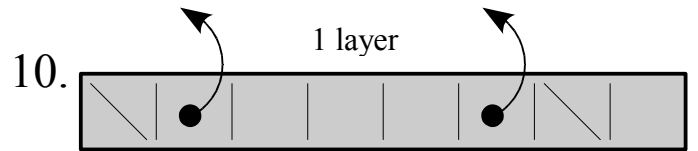
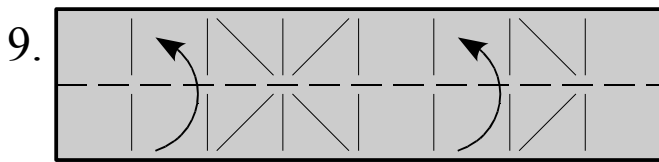
Pre-crease.



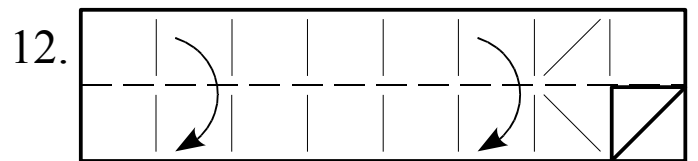
Re-pleat vertically, skipping the center.



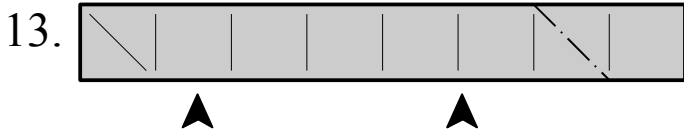
Pre-crease.



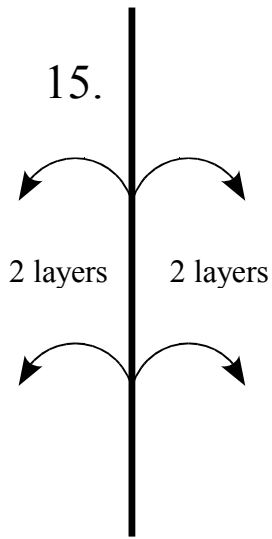
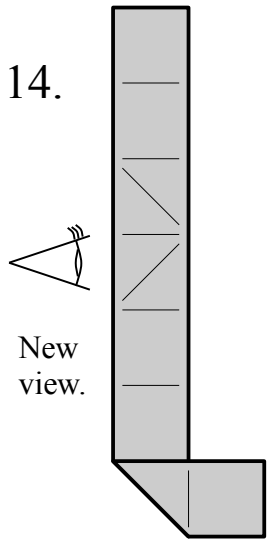
Dog-ear 3 layers (all the inner layers).



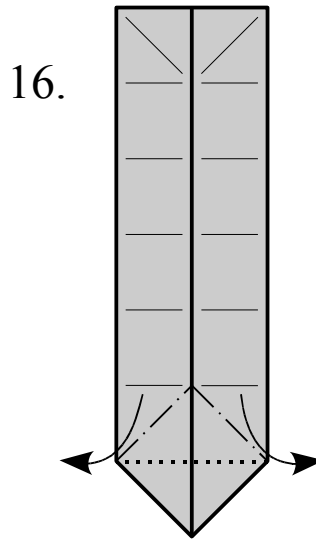
Close back up.



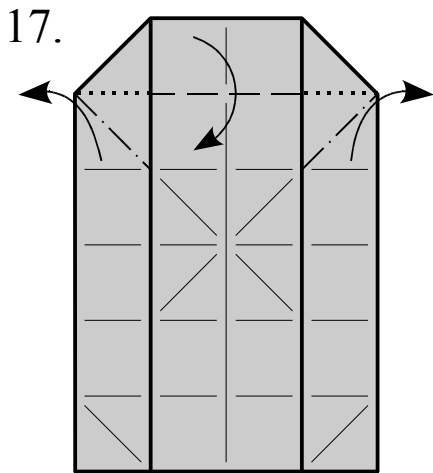
Inside-reverse fold upward on the pre-crease. Look ahead at the next couple of steps; fighting to close this neatly is unnecessary.



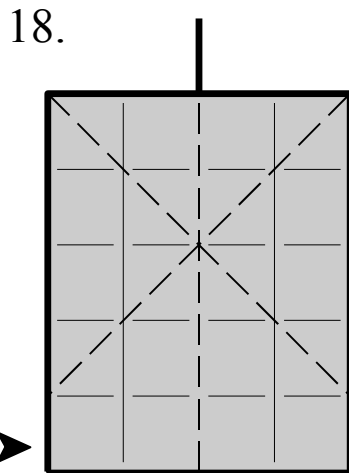
Open to the middle.



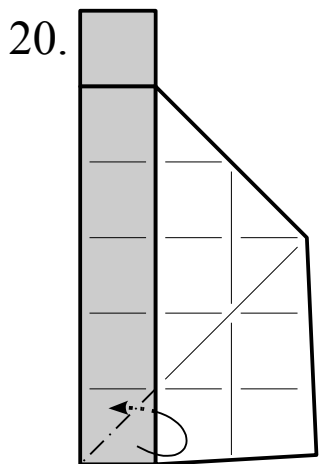
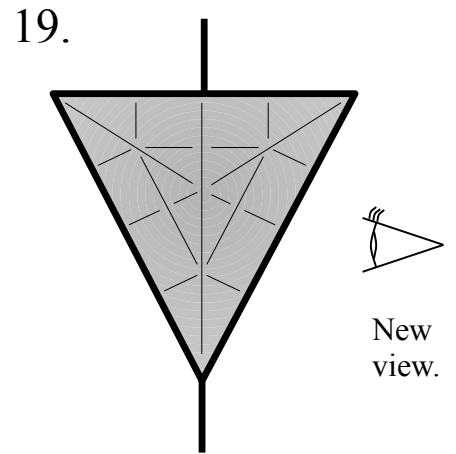
Shovel fold. (Pick up raw and folded edges on the center line and open, passing through a shape that looks like the scoop of a shovel. If you turn the model over while doing this, be sure to turn it back for the next step. These diagrams hold the model in place while the shovel folds flip back and forth.)



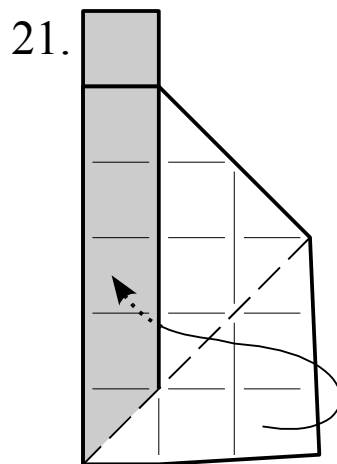
To stand up the three edges, stop a shovel fold midway.



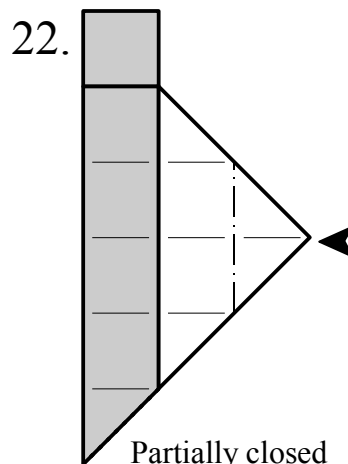
Fold the center to bring the lower corners together, so that the outline looks like a pine tree. Model bends on the diagonal pre-creases,



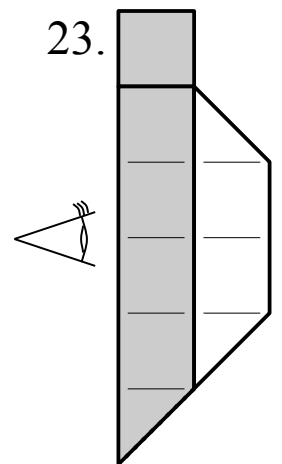
Tuck the dog-ear in using the pre-crease.



Tuck in all layers using the pre-crease.

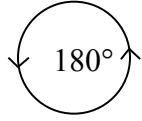
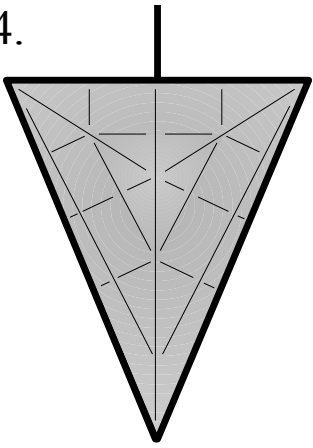


Partially closed sink to give the dish a flat bottom.

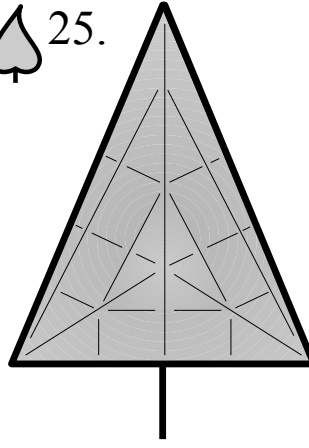

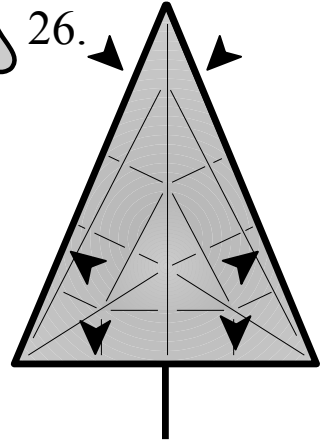

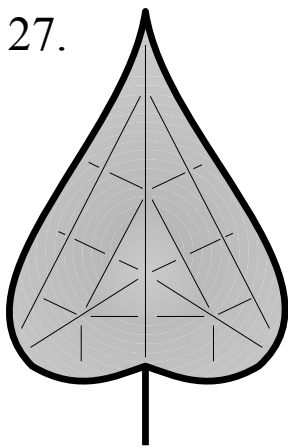

narrower for a Leaf.



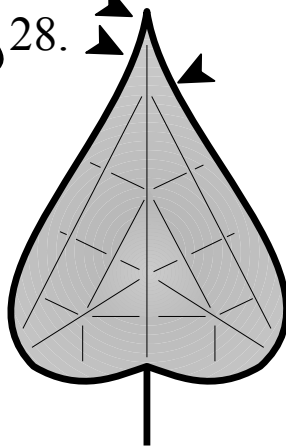
